

Description: Plant consisting of strongly pointed leaves growing progressively smaller up the fluted stem. One-inch flowers orange with a heavily fringed lip.
Habitat: terrestrial in open pinelands, savannahs, and moist roadsides

Notes from Prem's program

There are 106 native species in our state. 56 are found nowhere else in the U.S. and 4 are endemic, or found nowhere else in the world.. If you are interested in

searching for native orchids, their habitats include pine forests and roadsides next to these forests. Woodland areas in Central Florida, coastal scrub, swamps, hammocks and fields are also great places to search. State Road 65 in the Panhandle of Florida is a designated highway for wildflowers and Prem has seen thousands of orchids there. The first and second week of May, on State Road 92 towards Deland, you can find orchids in the median. Florida's butterfly orchid, Encyclia tampensis can be found in Myakka State Park near Sarasota and in Fort Christmas Historical Park on SR 50. There is a Ghost orchid in the Corkscrew Swamp. Happy hunting and don't forget our library has a Florida Native Orchids book.
