Thís was a great opportunity to socíalíze and ask questions of knowledgeable members.

First, sterilize your tools—Sally uses a blow torch. You can see the medium mixture she uses. See the May newsletter to get the ingredients and amounts. All old newsletters can be found at www.platinumcoastorchidsociety.org

Next she takes a cutting off of one of her large plants. Next she sprinkles some cinnamon on the cut part of the plant and checks to see in which direction the plant is growing. She places the plant in a pot with the back side of the cutting against the side of the pot and attaches the cutting to the ring she has made. You can also buy these rings for stabilizing your plant or you can attach to a hanger.

Next (below) she pours the medium mixture around the plant in the pot. Tap, tap, tap on the ground to settle the mixture around the roots.


