Our May speaker, Dave Sorokowsky, is from Paph Paradise Nursery in California. He has never spoken to our club so I'm excited to have him visit us. His topic will be "Don't Fear the Slippers". We have a few members that are successful growing Paphs so I'm hoping that more members will give these unique plants a try after hearing Dave's presentation. I particularly like that Paphs require much less shelf space than most and the flowers are very long lasting.

Our May meeting on the 8th is immediately after the Show, and we'll all still be tired from all the hard work at the Show, but please be sure to come to the meeting to meet our new members that join the club at the Show and to enjoy our excellent speaker.

Our new members from the show will probably be at this meeting. We look forward to giving them a warm welcome.




