WEDNESDAY, JULY 9TH—There will be no meeting this month, but please join us for a ramble at 6:30 at Holly Pardi's home at 1102 Fairlawn Drive, Rockledge (631-7417/604-9954)

Directions from SR520: turn south on Fiske Blvd. Drive pass the garden club & golf club; at Barton Blvd turn west (right) go the length of the divided medium; at the stop sign take another right (that's Fairlawn Dr). I live about 2/3's of the way down a long block (that runs along the south side of the Rockledge Golf Course). The house is the 2nd two-story Tudor style house on the right.

Directions from the Interstate: take the Fiske/Stadium (SR519) head north. You will pass Lowes, then 2 schools, Leavitt Park and Eyster Blvd. The next light is at Barton. Take a left and go the length of the divided medium. At the first stop sign take a right onto Fairlawn Dr. I live about 2/3's of the way down a long block (that runs along the south side of the Rockledge Golf Course). The house is the 2nd two-story Tudor style house on the right.


