"Originally many orchids were erroneously misclassified as Epidendrums. Eventually, Epi's, as we know them today, evolved into 3 main genera, Epidendrum, Encyclia and Prothechea (cockleshell orchids). The program will show you how to differentiate between them, and provide culture tips on how to grow them. All are members of the cattleya family, and most are easy to grow in Florida. Many have long-lasting flowers that are floriferous and fragrant, providing us with a wide range of colors and shapes. Their hybrids, Epicats, have become popular in recent years."


